



# Sludge Trends 2003-2013





## Rulemaking Update

- Completed:
  - Chapter 409, Processing Facilities 2014 (Odor)
  - Chapter 410, Composting Facilities 2014 (Odor)
- Under Development:
  - Chapter 418, Beneficial Use of Solid Wastes; Chapter 419, Agronomic Utilization of Residuals (418 Appendix A/RAGs)
  - Chapter 400, General Provisions (Hierarchy, Definitions)
  - Chapter 410 (Formatting)

#### Chapters 409 & 410 - 2014

- Resolves 2013, Chapter 43: Resolve, Directing the Department of Environmental Protection to Develop Quantitative Odor Management Standards
- Resolve specific to facilities that "process wastewater treatment plant sludge from publicly owned treatment works and facilities that process septage"
- Included facilities that compost those materials

# Chapters 409 & 410 - 2014 (cont)

- Method to quantify nuisance odors:
  - Approach includes FIDO method Frequency, Intensity, Duration and Offensiveness of odors
  - Intensity measured using modified n-butanol scale
  - Scale 1 through 5 intensity measurement using n-butanol field kits (150 ppm, 300 ppm, 600 ppm, 1,200 ppm, 2,400 ppm)

# Chapters 409 & 410 - 2014 (cont)

- Intensity of 4 at or beyond facility boundary for any duration is nuisance
- Intensity of 3 for 60 minutes, at least 3 days in 30-day period; at least 3 odor assessments in the 60-minute period
- Intensity of 2 for 90 minutes, at least 4 days in 30-day period; at least 4 odor assessments in the 90-minute period
- Existing facilities must comply by March 1, 2015
- Rule effective July 27, 2014



## **Chapters 418 & 419**

- Chapter 418 (Beneficial Use of Solid Wastes), Appendix A values to be updated
- Chapter 419 relies on Chapter 418, Appendix A for substances other than metals
- Chapter 418, Appendix A developed during rulemaking in the mid-1990s
- Risk data outdated
- Use Maine Remedial Action Guidelines for Sites Contaminated with Hazardous Substances (May 8, 2013) or Maine RAGs
- Chapter 418 public hearing on November 6, 2014
- Chapter 419 public comment only until November 17, 2014



## **Chapter 400**

- Incorporate waste hierarchy into general licensing criteria as required by legislation
  - Reduction of waste generated, including amount and toxicity
  - Reuse
  - Recycling
  - Composting
  - Processing that reduces volume, including incineration
  - Land disposal
- Definitions
- Public hearing on November 6, 2014
