

Asset Management Grants Awarded



Asset Management Funding

- Each community with wastewater infrastructure qualifies for up to 5 phases of asset management principal forgiveness, depending on the size and complexity of their system.
- Each phase is eligible for up to \$30,000
- Each community can ALSO get up to \$30,000 to include their stormwater assets into an AMP

Asset Management Program Development CWSRF Funding for Wastewater and Stormwater

\$2.12M

in CWSRF loan principal forgiveness pledged to 46 communities (so far)

Current Status:

- 4 projects completed
- 18 projects partially complete
- 24 projects in initial planning stages

Energy Audit Funding

- Through the CWSRF program, communities with wastewater infrastructure can qualify for up to \$20,000 in principal forgiveness for a comprehensive energy audit. These audits may include the WWTF, pumping stations or both.
