

PFAS

- 2022 legislation passed (PFAS in Drinking Water, Groundwater, and Surface Waters Act)
- Establishes/Requires:
 - Interim Drinking Water Standards 20 ppt and monitoring of all public water systems for PFAS by 7/1/23
 - Final drinking water standards by 6/1/24
 - Groundwater standards and Surface Water Action Levels by 12/31/23
 - Landfill monitoring by 12/31/22
 - Source Investigation Report by11/1/23 (https://dem.ri.gov/press-releases/dem-posts-draft-report-forever-chemicals-pfas-public-comment)







Surface Water

- Action Levels
 - PFOA
 - PFOS
 - PFHxS
 - PFNA
 - PFHpA
 - PFDA
 - PFHxA
 - PFPeA

Groundwater

- Groundwater
 Standards for the same 6 compounds
- GAA and GA
 Waters

Permits

- RIPDES permits
- POTWs
- Quarterly monitoring starting 2024
- Influent and Effluent
- SIU monitoring also to begin in 2024



Surface Water

- Defines "Action Levels"
- Creates a new section, section 1.30, that contains the Action Levels and Notification Requirements
 - Sum of PFOA, PFOS, PFHxS, PFNA, PFHpA, PFDA, <u>PFHxA, and PFPeA</u> ≥ 70 ng/L
 - Regulated entities shall notify DEM in writing within 15 calendar days receipt of an analytical results that exceed the action level or receipt of information indicating a discharge or release that cause an exceedance of the action level
 - Does NOT require duplicate reporting
 - Where Action Level is exceeded, DEM may require notification of relevant state agency, impacted communities (e.g., abutters), resampling, or further site investigation
- Creates a new sections, section 1.31 and 1.32, to deal with enforcement and penalties for failure to notify



Groundwater

- Updates the PFAS groundwater quality standard to
 - Sum of PFOA, PFOS, PFHxS, PFNA, PFHpA, and PFDA ≤ 20 ng/L
 - Only applies to GA and GAA groundwaters



Permits

- RIPDES permits
- Same 40 PFAS Analytes as EPA
- POTWs
- Quarterly monitoring starting 2024
- Influent and Effluent
- Annual SIU monitoring also to begin in 2024

Permitting Updates

MSGP

- Reissue 2nd Qtr 2024
- Updates BM Parameters from TSS/O&G to TSS/COD
- Resiliency Planning Requirements to be Added to SWMP
- Updates to BM Parameters for Certain Sectors



- PN late 2024
- SSO/Bypass
 - Electronic Reporting via NeT
 - 2/1/24 (POTWs)
 - 3/1/24 (non-POTs)






Staffing

- Created new Industrial/Municipal Stormwater Program
- Continued Staff Turnover
 - ~15% currently vacant
 - ~50% "new" (<5 years in position)
 - Certain Programs Impacted More OWTS, IPP, RIPDES
