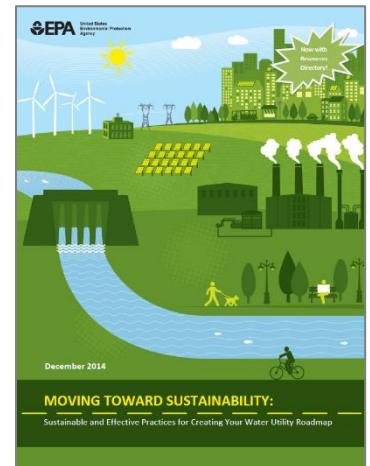
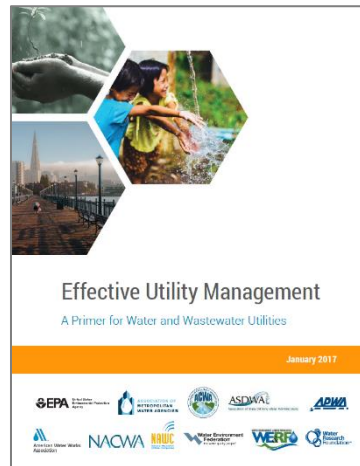

Driving Directions

From the Mass. Pike and Route 9 Eastbound:

1. Take Exit 12 to Route 9 east (toward Framingham);
2. turn right at the first set of lights onto Country Club Lane;
3. turn left onto Gates Street and bear left at the next stop sign;
4. at the following stop sign turn right and cross Salem End Road onto Badger Road. Turn into the Massachusetts Conference Center driveway on the right.

From Route 9 Westbound: Pass by the Natick Mall on the right; go about three miles passing over railroad tracks; continue past Temple Street staying in the left lane and make a left turn onto Country Club Lane at the lights by the reservoir; follow the directions from #3 above.
